Guest Presentation: Jan McManus	Some Ride2Care difficulties have been corrected through changes. Making face to face visit when there is facility complaint with mixed results. Jan met with R2C to review all complaints received from start of contract. They are changing the email address to "Oregon Concerns" so better ability to log response. RTC had provided report of complaints, but this new system should work better. There are major capacity gaps. Used to be 80K clients now 120K under Medicaid expansion. They are trying to recruit new drivers who have WAV vans under subcontract with Lyft & Uber. Jan then presented the "Tip Sheet for Ride to Care NEMT" along with a draft "Guide for Service Providers: Transportation Options for Medicaid Clients in Clackamas, Multnomah, and Washington Counties".
