What is DSAC?

DSAC is short for Disability Services

Advisory Council. The mission of the

DSAC is to provide input to Multnomah County Aging, Disability, & Veterans Services Division (ADVSD) on how best to serve people with disabilities in a respectful and conscientious manner.

DSAC members are people with disabilities and other people who are committed to seeing that Multnomah County Aging, Disability, & Veterans Services meets the needs of their clients/consumers.



Role of DSAC Members

- Provide advice to ADVSD on services.
- Provide advocacy for ADVSD clients/consumers.
- Listen to public comment regarding issues impacting people with disabilities.
- Learn about programs available to people with disabilities.
- Review the ADVS budget.
- Work with other local, regional and statewide organizations on disability issues.
- Advocate on relevant legislative matters at all levels of government.
- Educate the public about the policies and programs that impact people with disabilities.
- Collaborate with the Multicultural Action Committee and Senior Advisory Council as needed.
- Advocate on behalf of the larger community for systems-level changes.
