Result of "No" Vote: "No" vote retains current law whereby salaries paid by state to specified officials are established by legislation.  Yes  No  Measure 117 Gives voters option to rank candidates in order of preference; candidate receiving majority of votes in final round wins  Result of "Yes" Vote: "Yes" vote gives voters the option to rank candidates in order of preference for specified federal and statewide offices. Establishes process for tallying votes in rounds, with the candidate receiving the fewest votes in each round being defeated and votes for the defeated candidate going to the voter's next-highest ranked active candidate. Result of "No" Vote: "No" vote retains existing corporate minimum taxes on Oregon sales; twelve tax brackets impose different tax amounts, capped at \$100,000 tax on sales exceeding \$100,000,000.
