Arts Tax Fact Sheet 2015

ARTS TAX BASICS

- Any adult (18 years of age and older)
- Who lives in the City of Portland
- And has an income of at least \$1000 a year
- Needs to pay \$35 per adult for the Arts Tax
- Separate from filing federal & state taxes
- Applies even if you do not file taxes



ARE YOU EXEMPT from paying the Arts Tax?

Any person with an **income of less than \$11,770** or a couple with an income of less than \$15,930 is **exempt** from paying the Arts Tax **but you need to complete the Arts Tax form annually to claim the exemption and provide proof of income by sending in a copy of your tax form or federal form 4506-T.**

If you are over 70 years of age or are permanently disabled and meet the income guidelines (above), you can complete the form for a <u>Permanent Exemption</u> and not have to complete the form each year.

TAX IS DUE

- Due date is April 18, 2016
- Penalty for paying after April 18 is \$15; and after Oct 17 is \$35
