Executive Summary

This program offer reflects a reduction in state funding (SB1145) of \$3,300,533. To meet this target, the Adult Services Division (ASD) requests backfill funding totaling \$2,769,778 for 19.00 FTE. These positions come from multiple programs within the Adult Services Division, most of them are currently vacant. Additionally, ASD requests backfill funding for \$530,755 in contract services.

Program Description

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1.00 Sworn Community Justice Manager and 2.00 Parole-Probation Officers (PPO) from the Women's and Family Services Unit (50027). 3.00 Records Technicians and 2.00 Records Coordinators from the Adult Records and Administrative Services (50017). 2.00 Community Works Leaders from the Community Service Program (50031). 1.00 PPO, 1.00 Corrections Counselor, and 1.00 Corrections Technician from the Assessment and Referral Center (50021). 1.00 Digital Forensics Examiner from the Business Applications and Technology (BAT) team (50002). 1.00 PPO from the Adult Field Supervision - West Unit (50023). 1.00 Sworn Community Justice Manager and 3.00 PPOs from the Multnomah County Justice Reinvestment Program (MCJRP) (50022 & 50023).

Additionally, ASD requests backfill funding for \$530,755 in contract services: Transitional housing (50034), Sex Offense Treatment (50025), and Direct Client Assistance (50021) typically used for meeting basic needs of individuals new to supervision in Multnomah County like hygiene, clothing, and transit fares.

DCJ has spent the past 10 years implementing policy and practice changes in line with criminal justice reform efforts at the local, state, and national level. As a result, we now supervise the highest risk, highest need individuals in Multnomah County, while exploring intervention and prevention methods to reduce recidivism and increase public safety. We are anticipating reductions in state funding and are asking for this restoration to maintain critical services and support for this high risk population during all time high levels of community violence. This funding will maintain accountability measures for this population and balance workload for frontline DCJ staff, who served during the COVID-19 pandemic and the rise in community violence.
