Executive Summary

DCJ's FY 2024 budget received a one-time-only County General Fund Backfill of \$2,912,376 in August 2023 to help us bridge operations in the wake of significant SB 1145 funding reductions from the State Legislature. After a comprehensive analysis of workload and service utilization, we prioritized the following positions and services to request \$2,571,803 in ongoing funding.
