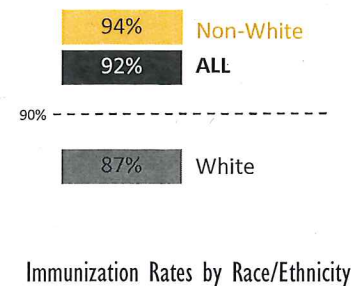
### EARLY KINDERGARTEN TRANSITION PROGRAM

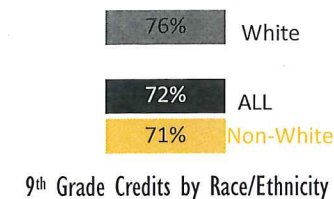
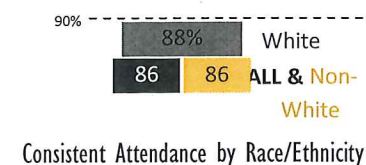
### SERVICES FOR SEXUAL MINORITY YOUTH

graduated high school



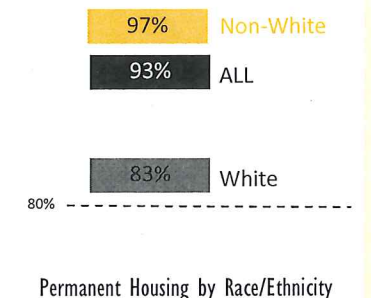
## FAMILIES

### ANTI-POVERTY/STABILITY SERVICES

Client engagement services, rent assistance and client assistance funds that support families to gain and maintain stable housing and increase their skills leading to increased income.

943 families, representing 3,461 individuals

93% of families who  
received rent  
assistance remained  
in permanent  
housing 6 months  
after exit
