Community as unit of identity vs. inclusion of specific patients/clients and stakeholders, role of community agencies and stakeholder organizations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Academics and community working together: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Community-Keeps research respectful, accessible and socially relevant ○ Academics- Keep research scientifically sound and academically relevant • Infrastructure can have significant impact on power sharing and project success: Co PIS's, steering committees, councils, advisory boards, teams, research assistants, interns, students • Processes- think about processes for community, power sharing, decision making, accommodations, ongoing evaluation, authorship, data ownership etc... Shared vision, jointly created ground rules, clear roles and responsibilities
