SUN Spotlight

Woodland Elementary has been a SUN school for two years now and hosted EKT- Early Kindergarten Transition program for the first time during the summer of the 2015-2016 school year. During this program our parent educator built trusting and strong relationships with our incoming kindergarten parents. This opportunity has allowed families to feel welcomed and valued and experience a strong sense of connection and community as their child started their journey into the school system. The same EKT parents started taking interest in other family engagement opportunities at school because they felt comfortable and involved already at the start of the school year.
