### **Risk Assessment**

There was a request to learn about criminal justice risk assessments. PSU's Kris Henning presented "Introduction to Risk Assessment for Criminal Justice & Related Administrators." The presentation addressed what forensic risk assessment is, why we need them, how they are done and how they should be done, how risk scales are developed and evaluated, and recommendations for selecting and using risk assessment scales.
