TRAFFICKING INDICATORS

No one specific indicator signals someone is in 'the life', but the combination of the indicators could be due to involvement.

- History of physical/sexual violence
- Chronic runaway/homeless youth
- Multiple systems involvement (e.g. law enforcement, DHS, JDH, mental health)
- Inconsistent amounts of cash or possessions compared with known income
- Inconsistent or unclear stories
- Fear, anxiety, or depression
- Relationship with adults or older men
- Lack of disclosure concerning whereabouts
- Use of lingo or slang
- Not in control of their money
- Reluctance to explain tattoo or marking
- Substance use
- Frequent sexually transmitted diseases or pregnancies
- Multiple cell phones
