Introductions, Announcements, and Approval of Minutes

Abbey Stamp opened the meeting, and introductions were made.

Announcements:

- Sheriff Mike Reese provided an update on the fire and evacuations in the Gorge. He thanked Portland Police and State Troopers for helping protect property.
- Sheriff Mike Reese also noted the Jail Population was a little over 95% today.
- Judge Nan Waller announced the new Judge Benjamin Souede.
- Judge Nan Waller also noted a November 19th event about Japanese Internment, co-hosted by Peggy Nagae and George Nikkata (?).
- Mayor Ted Wheeler noted the end of the Portland Police Bureau's gang designation list.
- Mayor Ted Wheeler mentioned the weekend's protests and lessons learned.
- Deena Corso extended two invitations: 1) Juvenile Services Farm to Table Dinner, and 2) the 25th anniversary celebration of JDAI on October 19th.
- Rod Underhill announced Multnomah County is hosting the 4th annual Summit of Counties on October 2nd to address the backlog of Sexual Assault Forensic Evidence (SAFE) kits.
- Abbey Stamp noted the next What Works Conference will take place with CJC in

2019. If there are objections or ideas about timely themes, let Abbey know.

Dept of Public Safety Standards and Training (DPSST) Overview

Dept. of Community Justice Juvenile Services Division: Detention Update

Deena Corso presented Utilization of Pre-Adjudication Detention and Length of Stay

Analysis, which included background and decision-making for detention placement and
Juvenile Detention Alternatives Initiatives (JDAI) Core Strategies. Data about referrals
and lengths of stay were shown. It was highlighted that the length of stay is trending up
even though serious crime is down. Intake overrides of the risk assessment have
increased and continues to identify other factors of detention use. There will be more
information and discussion at the October LPSCC meeting.
