


How has MCSO's jail population fluctuated over the last few months?

- In October 2017, MCSO's average daily jail population (ADP) was 1,112, which is 93% of its budgeted capacity of 1,192
 - MCSO's jail population exceeded 95% capacity on 7 days in October
- While MCSO's ADP has shown very little fluctuation over the last 4
 months on a month-to-month basis, there have been significant
 fluctuations on a week-to-week basis (i.e. increase in jail population
 over the course of the weekend)

What are some factors that influence MCSO's jail population?

- Total bookings: Though MCSO typically sees a reduction in standard bookings between the warmer months and autumn, this has not been the case in 2017
 - In 2016, standard bookings fell 12.6% from May to October
 - In 2017, bookings have declined only 1.4% from May to October
- **PPB Bookings**: The Portland Police Bureau (PPB) is responsible for more MCSO standard bookings than all other bookings agencies combined
 - Despite reduced MCSO jail bed capacity, PPB made more standard bookings in September and October 2017 than it did in September and October 2016
- Other factors include:
 - Sanctions and sanction length
 - Transfers
 - Other holds
 - Available release options

Who is released as a part of Emergency Releases?

- Of the 70 inmates released as a part of emergency releases since July 22nd, (40%) were MCJRP clients
 - 3 of the 70 released were participating in the Treatment Readiness Dorm
- Of the 20 inmates released in emergency releases on July 22nd and July 23rd:
 - 7 of 20 (35%) have been re-booked into jail as of November 2nd
 - All 7 of these re-bookings have contained a warrant
 - 3 of the 7 have been re-booked multiple times since their release
