Dept. of Community Justice Juvenile Services Division: Detention Discussion

Deena Corso, DCJ Juvenile Services presented <u>Utilization of Pre-Adjudication Detention and Length of Stay Analysis Part II</u>. Data trends (originally presented at LPSCC in September) were summarized; drivers of increased utilization and length of stay were reviewed and discussed; action steps were noted. For more information, see the presentation.

Notable discussion points included:

- There may be renewed Risk Assessment Instrument (RAI) training for judges and attorneys.
- It is time to revalidate the RAI.
- There is a lack of placement capacity, especially for youth with mental health needs.
- Placement decisions need to be reviewed with an eye towards reducing disparities.

Judge Waller announced there will be a JDAI recommitment event on October 19th.

John Haines, Mercy Corps NW, distributed a handout and described the status, impact and funding situation the Mercy Corps Northwest's Reentry Transition Center (RTC),
