

Detoxification Services

Ideal for men or women who need to be medically monitored to manage withdrawal from alcohol or opiates. Staffed 24/7.

- Child Welfare
- Corrections

Residential

Treatment Services
Ideal for individuals who have a
severe substance use disorder.
Facilities are staffed 24/7
and unlocked.

Outpatient Treatment Services Ideal for youth or adults who

deal for youth or adults who have a mild to moderate substance use disorder.

Peer Mentor Services

The majority of substance use providers employ Certified Recovery Mentors who have lived experience and are an integral part of the treatment experience.
