Use of Naloxone

- 2014 259 people — 370 doses
- 2015 252 people — 379 doses
- 2016 274 people — 400 doses
- 2017 293 people — 435 doses


Morbidity

- 2016 24 people died related to overdoses
- 2017 25 people died related to overdoses
- 2018 Jan 1–March 24 at least five cardiac
arrests due to overdoses


