Mission & Vision

• The Multnomah County Local Public Safety Coordinating Council (LPSCC) was established by Senate Bill 1145 (1995) to coordinate local criminal justice policy among affected criminal justice entities.

Funding Risks and Challenges

- County General Fund \$729,000 (Internal Services - DSSJ)
 - External assessment recommended additional DSSJ investment, currently unable to follow through due to constraint
- SB 1145 (State) \$552,177
 - Unknown impact on all ongoing staff -- biennial allocation
- Justice Reinvestment (State) \$666,056
 - Unknown impact on victims services and MCJRP -- biennial budget process
- MacArthur Foundation \$240,000
 - Unknown funding beyond September 2019
