




### Data and Evaluation Model




# Multnomah County Staff: Program Monitoring

# Impact Evaluation

### **Current Process**

**Quarterly Snapshot** 

useful to examine dosage and composition of services

### Are we on the right road?

Services: Internal programming monitoring at the agency/site level of services



- Outcomes: Annual reporting of outcomes
  - Answers the question "What are the successes of the youth, families, and communities engaging in SUN services?"

#### Have we arrived at our destination?

 Moving toward this process to link outcomes and impacts that can be attributed to SUN services

# **Upcoming Efforts**

#### 1. Reviewing and refining the System's indicators and outcomes

- The County is in the process of developing a new strategic framework that includes:
  - System indicators to inform service provision
  - Relevant outcomes
  - And demonstrates relationship to population impact.
- As part of this we will be reviewing the current SUN measures and logic models. May involve the revision of program models and identified outcomes.
- This year we will begin the process with the following SUN Services:
  - Youth Advocacy, Community Schools, Parent Child Development Services, and Multnomah Stability Initiative

# 2. Systematically looking at individual services to understand impact

# Initial Steps for Linking Outcomes to Impact

- Will focus initial efforts on measuring the impact of SUN Youth Advocacy.
- Narrow the focus to actionable steps that can move towards meeting the overall goal of showing impact.
  - Research and evaluation activities that illustrate impact can be time and resource intensive.
- May also include intermediate work to better understand the relationships between service provision and outcomes.
  - Ex: Based on the existing body of research, is there a minimum number of hours of case management needed in youth programming to predict successful outcomes?

# **Theory of Change: Outcomes**

#### SHORT-TERM OUTCOMES: CHILDREN/YOUTH

- Children are at the appropriate stage of development (early childhood)
- Immunizations Current (early childhood)
- Children attend Early Kindergarten Transition program
- Consistent School Attendance
  - o Kindergarten, 6th Grade, 9th Grade
- Students meeting benchmark or growth target in Reading and Math
  - 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade Reading, 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Math
- High School Credit Attainment
  - 9th Grade credit attainment
- High School Graduation
- Suspensions and Expulsions
- Socio-emotional assets
  - o Sense of belonging (engagement)
  - o Sense of cultural identity
  - Growth mindset
  - o Positive relationship with at least one adult

#### SHORT-TERM OUTCOMES: FAMILIES

- Housing Stability
- Family Income
  - Increased income
  - Improvement in ratio of income to expenses
- Social Capital growth in relationship/social networks that :
  - o Provide mutual support
  - Reinforce the family's culture and values
- Adult Education Level
  - o Adult high school graduation or GED attainment
  - o Enrollment of school-aged children in school
  - o Adult completion of a job training program
- Wellness and Health
  - o Improvement in food security
  - o Gain or maintenance of health coverage

#### Theory of Change


We will improve the wellbeing of our entire community by collaborating and integrating strategies and services that have been shown to improve educational outcomes for people of color and those living in poverty.






#### ANTI-POVERTY/STABILITY SERVICES

Client engagement services, rent assistance and client assistance funds that support families to gain and maintain stable housing and increase their skills leading to increased income.

833 families, representing 2,844 individuals

88.8 % of families who received rent assistance remained in permanent housing 6 months after exit



## **Additional Outcome Example #1**

### **SUN Community Schools Teacher surveys**

At the end of the school year, teachers noted observing growth in areas related to academic behavior including:

- •71% improved academic performance
- •69% improved class participation
- •60% improved getting along with peers



# **Additional Outcome Example #2**

### Youth Advocacy Case plan goal progress/ achievement

- 96% of students made progress or achieved goals around self-esteem
- 96.3% of students made progress or achieved goals around pro-social friends and activities
