LPSCC Youth and Gang Violence Work

Lili Yamamoto shared what the LPSCC Y&GV Subcommittee does and gave an overview of the <u>Youth & Gang Violence Gang Assessment's 6 Strategies</u>.

YAV and WIB Partnership

Applied for and received a grant for youth action research. They will be doing focus groups.

Small Group Discussion

Takeaways from the small group discussions:

1. Gun Violence

School Shootings are a major concern for youth. It seems youth of color are more affected, and it feels like nothing is being done. Young people need to be heard. Elected officials need to do more outreach to youth to talk about youth safety and what they need. Need support for youth who have been traumatized. Resources for youth need to be discussed at schools, community events, libraries, etc.

2. Police Violence

History, pain, trauma, fear, relationships, and accountability were discussed.

3. Mental Health/Support for Youth in the Juvenile Justice System

There are services, but youth aren't engaging for many reasons:

- The service community doesn't look like the community
- Trauma isn't been addressed
- Parents aren't notified

Next Steps:

Juvenile Services Division (JSD) wants youth voice to inform work. Mary wants to hear about how to support and learn from the Youth Action Research.

Need more Summer Works opportunities. Youth of all ages need money and experience. It is budget time with the county. Can we build on work that is being done?

Paid Internship could be a Y&GV agenda item. Age is a barrier -- can we lower the age?

Can there be a lobby day?
