Tualatin Valley Fire & Rescue (TVF&R) is seeking a levy renewal for 45 cents per \$1000 of assessed valuation, the same as TVF&R's existing rate. The current levy expires in June 2020. Levy renewals require voter approval. For a property assessed at \$300,000, about the average in TVF&R's service area, the cost of the levy would be approximately \$135 per year or about \$11.25 per month. If the levy renewal does not pass, funding that currently supports at least 92 of 432 TVF&R firefighters and paramedics would be lost. TVF&R's firefighters and paramedics respond to emergency incidents like fires, heart attacks, car crashes, and rescue operations. Funding for other staff positions that support TVF&R's operations would also be lost. If the levy passes, levy funds will maintain
	firefighter, paramedic, and support staff positions. Proceeds will also be used to purchase land for future fire stations, fire hose, firefighting tools, and medical equipment. An estimate of the total amount of money to be raised for each year of the proposed levy renewal is:
