If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.  This measure authorizes the City to issue up to \$30 million in bonds to acquire real property for open space or parks, or to renovate, replace or develop park and recreation facilities. Uses will be guided by the city's current and future parks and capital improvement plans. The bonds will be payable over a period of up to 20 years.  The bonds will be repaid from property taxes. The resulting tax rate is estimated to be not more than \$0.24 per \$1000 of assessed value. For a property with an assessed value (not real market value) of \$500,000, the annual cost would be \$120.
