	<p>2. Audience: Peers, Providers, and Consumers</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Multnomah Marketplace (MMP) system: All new contract renewals and RFPQ's will be done through Marketplace. Please make sure your agency profile has been completed in the new system and is up to date. If you should have any problem with the registration process, we can give technical assistance. ● State Plan Amendment - OHA is trying to create an additional funding stream for peer-run organizations. This state amendment would allow peer organizations to bill Medicaid directly. There will be two listening sessions at Fourth Dimension: 10:00 am - 12:00 pm and 1:00 pm - 3:00 pm. ● Impact Northwest: Client Emergency Basic Needs (CEBN) funding. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Effective February 1st, will be requiring MOTS ID # for every client. - CBEN can be accessed to meet client's emergency basic needs. It is for clients involved in Multnomah County funded treatment facilities. Most facilities have 2 CBEN representatives that have been designated to make requests for CBEN funds. ● Adventist Emotional Wellness Center: It is an intensive outpatient day treatment program that focuses specifically on mental health treatment. They can accept patients with dual diagnosis as long as they are not actively using and are committed to recovery. They take Medicare. They also provide TMS - Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation, which is an alternative non-invasive treatment for those with those with chronic depression, that has not been successfully treated with traditional medication therapy.
<p>Program Spotlight 1.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Lifeworks Northwest: Project Network: serves women and their dependent children with a total capacity to serve 34 women and 22 children. We serve African American, culturally-responsive addictions, mental health and common forms of treatment services. It is a residential site. We have members with dual diagnosis credentials and counselors on site. We have 14 counselors, mentors, and case managers. A weekly meet and greet informational group is provided for potential clients that they are required to attend to get a feel of the milieu. Group meets every Friday. Currently, there is a long waitlist of about 3 to 6 weeks. Pregnant, IV users are top priorities. Clients can show up to the group meeting and be screened. Treatment may be 4 to 6 months and is very individualized. For families with 3 to 4 children, we can only take one family. For families with 2 kids - up to 4 families. Age limit for kids is usually not over 9 or 10 years old, but they work to meet the needs of clients and make considerations on a case-by-case basis.

<p>Program Spotlight 2</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Dual Diagnosis Anonymous of Oregon (DDA): Doyle Smith is the Executive Director and Jennifer Springsteen is the Administrative Service Manager. DDA is a peer-run organization with a mission to provide hope for those that suffer from Dual Diagnosis. Funded with organizations and funders that align with our mission statement and approved through a board. It involves peer support. We have 4000 contacts in the state of Oregon, and have gone international. They have been successful because they have worked to partner with other organizations and bring meetings to the places where clients are already accessing services.
<p>Updates</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Reconciliations: We first completed the FY-18 reconciliations, where we compare service utilization and funding received. Trying to settle up for FY-18. Will be asking for funding back if there was under-utilization. And trying to provide funding for services provided over what was funded (over-utilization) as well as fund some proposals for new services. Trying to navigate away from this lengthy reconciliation process. Changing payment methods in FY-20. The County is trying to navigate away from monthly allotment payments, where you received funding ahead of providing services and moving towards fee-for-service or cost reimbursement payments. We have met with the majority of the providers. We are meeting with every provider with services in their contract subject to the reconciliation process. FY19 - Completed 6 months of this fiscal year at this point and will be doing a reconciliation of the first 6 months of this fiscal year. Because of timely filing rules, we have to wait 90 days but we want to encourage you to try to get your claims in if you provided services as soon as possible before the deadline at the end of March. A lot of our funding comes down through the State and June 30th is the end of the State biennium, so what we don't spend, we have to pay back to the state. We want to try and keep the dollars in Multnomah County. ● PhTech: We will be trying to bundle all billing/PHtech changes into a quarterly update so there is a list of things that will be changing effective April 1. After the February meeting, we will send out a Memo summarizing all the upcoming changes and then will go over the changes in detail during the March Quarterly Billing Meeting. One item that we are currently rolling out is a timely filing waiver request form. Currently timely filing for submitting claims is 90 days from the date of service. Once you have an adjudication on a claim, there are 90 days from that date to file a collective claim or resubmit. This is different from Healthshare, where that payor allows 365 days to adjudicate a claim. Starting in April, we will have the form on the website and it will be required for all

	waiver request. Please, encourage billing folks at your agency to attend the March meeting for more clarification on all the upcoming changes.
