Spotlight 1 – De Paul Treatment Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Presented by Sandy Parkin and Chaney Reel Davis • De Paul Medical Services presentation on services: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Detox Ctr – 16-bed capacity, new site in 2021 will have 24 beds for treatment for stimulants, opiates and alcohol. Social and medical detox. ○ Youth and Family Ctr. – Male identified only – 12 beds ○ Adult Ctr – medically 3.7 level of care. In 2022 – 56 beds for men and 28 beds for women. Current capacity is 5-7 beds. ○ Hospital Outreach thru downtown center
Spotlight 2 – Older Adult Behavioral Health	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Presented by Laurel Wonder, Max Harvey and Jill Williams • In Multnomah County the Older Adult Behavioral Health Initiative is funded by the Oregon Health Authority for the team to collaborate with providers and individuals • Collaboration – for better and more integrated services for older adults <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Clients served include adults 50 and above and persons with physical disabilities. ○ The team collaborates with agencies on special projects and areas in need of improvement and development • Complex Case Consultation <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Consultation is provided for individuals with complex needs. This can include consultation directly to providers or involve meeting with individuals to provide 1:1 assessment and consultation

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	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Coast is a monthly multi-disciplinary team meeting to discuss individuals with complex needs ● Workforce development <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Direct community education on whatever topic of interest ○ Training including 30 minutes to Full-Day Conferences. Spring and Fall Training Series. <p>Spotlight 3 – Bridgeway Residential Gambling</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Presented by Julio Iniguez, Clinical Supervisor of Bridgeway’s Residential Gambling Treatment Program ● Santiam House – 8-bed co-ed facility – gambling specific ● Overview of Gambling Disorder <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Awareness raising and education important in behavioral health fields, as is screening for problem gambling behavior ○ Gambling disorder is a hidden addiction. It is a recovery addiction ○ Population with substance abuse and mental health disorders are the most vulnerable to developing a gambling addiction. It is the most difficult to succeed ○ Gambling is a relapse trigger to mental health and substance abuse ○ More ER visits for DV related to gambling rather than alcohol ○ Higher suicidality rate ○ 5% and 20% of substance abuse have a gambling addiction, and are more likely to drop out of detox treatment ● Diagnostic criteria: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Tolerance withdrawal ○ Gambling to escape ○ Loss of job and relationships ○ Lying ○ Chasing losses
