RESOLUTION NO. 2020-006

Filling a Vacancy in the Legislative Assembly, Oregon House of Representatives, District 36.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a. Effective December 30, 2019 there is a vacancy in Oregon State Senate, District 36, due to the resignation of Representative Jennifer Williamson.
- b. Pursuant to state law, the Democratic Party Precinct Committeepersons of House District 36 met to choose nominees to fill the vacancy.
- c. The nominees chosen were: Chris Beck, Rob Fullmer, Akasha Lawrence-Spence, Lisa Reynolds, and Laurie Wimmer.
- d. In accordance with procedures established by the Secretary of State, the Multnomah County Board of Commissioners considered the nominations at a regular board meeting at 5:00 pm on January 16, 2020.
- e. At the conclusion of the public meeting the Commissioners voted to appoint Akasha Lawrence-Spence to fill the vacancy, said nominee having received the highest number of votes as indicated on the vote tabulation attached as Exhibit A.


The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Resolves:


1. Akasha Lawrence-Spence is selected as the appointee to fill the vacancy in the Oregon House of Representatives, District 36.
2. This Resolution shall promptly be forwarded to the Secretary of State as required by ORS 171.060(3).


