<b>Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Updates</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Situation Reports will be released daily around 6:00 pm.</li> <li>● &gt; The Multnomah County Emergency Operations Center is currently open seven days a week, and will be open normal hours Sunday - 8am-5pm.</li> <li>● &gt; The Oregon Health Authority held a press conference to announce four new presumptive cases of COVID-19 in Oregon, including one new case in Washington County. The first presumptive case was also announced in Clark County, Washington.</li> <li>● &gt; The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) provided new guidance (<a href="#">here</a>) recommending that older adults and people who have severe chronic medical conditions stay home as much as possible and avoid crowds. This guidance was approved by the Oregon Health Authority (OHA).</li> <li>● &gt; Regional health press conferences are now scheduled every Monday and Thursday at 2pm to provide COVID-19 updates.</li> <li>● Guidance is being finalized for individuals experiencing homelessness outside of shelters. The guidance will also support those performing outreach to the unsheltered community.</li> <li>● &gt; Homeless shelter capacity is being maintained while guidance is also being implemented to prevent transmission. A key goal is to space the sick away from the well in these shared living environments.</li> <li>● &gt; A plan is being finalized for the care of moderately-ill residents of homeless shelters and camps.</li> <li>● &gt; Guidance is being finalized which will advise county residents when to seek healthcare and how to tell the difference between mild and serious illness.</li> </ul>	

- ➤ The Logistics Section has been working to fill new positions in the Emergency Operations Center for the upcoming week, in response to the national and state increase in the number of COVID-19 cases.
- ➤ New resource requests for personal protective equipment for healthcare workers and first responders were submitted to the State.
- ➤ City of Gresham Emergency Management coordinated with Multnomah County on Continuity of Operations (COOP) planning.

- The curriculum from county COVID-101 outreach workshops is now available [here](#). The curriculum is designed to be used by those who do culturally or population-specific work in the community (community health workers, home visitors, patient navigators, peer support specialists, etc.).
- COVID-19 informational videos began filming yesterday (Spanish, Vietnamese, Chinese, Russian, and Somali, with other languages other than English being planned) and will resume production on Monday. The videos are expected to be completed and available on the County website next week.
- Liaisons with subject-matter expertise have been identified to provide support to community organizations, businesses, and agencies. The identified liaisons will meet on Monday to coordinate situational information and begin plans to conduct train the trainer outreach. The liaisons are now available to provide information to agencies and community organizations that perform work across various sectors. The list of liaisons is below, and they can be contacted by members of their respective sectors. Sectors where a liaison is not shown are not yet filled. If you are interested in serving as a liaison, please contact the Liaison Unit Leader. Please note that the cost for non-county staff interested and able to fill vacant roles will be the responsibility of their organization.

### Emergency Support Function 8: Health & Medical

- This is a dynamic situation. Information and case counts are changing rapidly and the incident is on-going.
- CDC testing criteria for COVID-19 has changed. The Oregon Health Authority is actively working on updating Oregon's testing criteria and new guidance will be provided by the Tri-County Health Officer.

- >101,927 confirmed cases (3,735 new in the last 24 hours at time of report) and 3,486 confirmed deaths (106 new) worldwide.
  - There are confirmed cases in 93 Countries/territories/areas. Countries with their first reported case in the last 24 hours are Colombia, Peru, Togo, and the Vatican City.
