<u>Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Updates</u>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Situation Reports will be released daily at approximately 6:00 pm. ● > The State of Oregon announced four new cases today - located in Deschutes, Marion, Polk, and Umatilla Counties. A press release was issued, and can be read here. ● > On March 11, Governor Brown announced an executive order banning mass gatherings with more than 250 people and is encouraging other forms of social distancing, such as having employers encouraging telework as much as possible. ● Multnomah County announced its first presumptive case of COVID-19 yesterday. Multnomah County issued a press release about the case, which can be read here. ● On March 8, Oregon Gov. Kate Brown declared a state of emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak. The state of emergency will remain in effect for 60 days, but could be extended if necessary. ● Regional health press conferences are now scheduled every Monday and Thursday at 2pm to provide COVID-19 updates. At Monday's press conference state and local health officers urged all Oregonians to help protect older adults and people with serious underlying health conditions. A complete recap of the press conference can be read here. ● On Monday, The Oregon Legislature voted unanimously to allocate \$5 million to assist with the response to COVID-19. ● > The Logistics Unit received a total of 20 resource requests. Eleven of those resource requests were elevated to the Oregon Office of Emergency Management, which were mostly for personal protective equipment (as of 11:00am). ● The Logistics Unit arranged the delivery of 1,400 additional blankets yesterday to the Joint Office of Homeless Services. 	

- >The Tri-County Health Officer and County Chair held a coordination call with venues and event coordinators to review coming guidance for mass gatherings.
- >Oregon Health Authority ran a webinar for community partners and the majority of the 200 participants were from Multnomah County.
- The Multnomah County Office of Diversity and Equity will develop examples of responses for staff and the public who witness discriminatory behavior related to COVID-19.
- >The Multnomah County Office of Diversity and Equity began developing equity considerations for the EOC.
- >Multnomah County is refining internal staff communication strategies around COVID-19.
- >Multnomah County began planning for satellite EOC to support operations and to socially distance.
- Multnomah County is exploring free flu vaccines as a way to keep people healthy and engaged in their daily lives.
- Homeless shelter capacity is being maintained while implementing guidance to prevent transmission. A key goal is to separate the sick and the well in shared living environments.
 - The City of Portland and Multnomah County worked collaboratively to extend winter shelter capacity for the foreseeable future.

Situational News Outside Multnomah County

- >The World Health Organization declared COVID-19 to be a global pandemic.
- >Italy announced the nationwide closure of all businesses except for grocery stores, pharmacies, banks, and public transit.
- >The State of Washington announced restrictions on crowds of 250 or more in King, Snohomish, and Pierce Counties. The City of Seattle also announced all public schools are to close for at least two weeks.

Emergency Support Function 8: Health & Medical

- This is a dynamic situation. Information and case counts are changing rapidly and the incident is on-going.
- >The Oregon Health Authority has changed the personal protective equipment recommendation for COVID-19 testing. Once testing is offered by commercial labs, standard outpatient and hospital facilities should be able to perform testing without specialized equipment.
- >Communicable Disease Team continues to follow-up with cases and monitor their contacts.

- >118,326 confirmed cases (4,627 new in the last 24 hours at time of report) and 4,292 confirmed deaths (280 new) worldwide.
 - There are confirmed cases in 113 countries, territories, and areas. Areas with their first reported case in the last 24 hours are Bolivia, Burkina Faso, DR Congo, and Jamaica.

- [The CITY OF PORTLAND's Homeless and Urban Camping Impact Reduction Program currently provides eight portable toilets with interior handwashing stations and is adding another seven today. They will also add eighteen standalone handwashing stations with water and soap to the current amount of seven. As soon as these stations are placed, the City's Emergency Coordination Center's GIS unit will provide a publicly shareable map link which can be posted on local agency websites.](#)

Multnomah County Emergency Operations Center

- ➤ In consultation with the Oregon Health Authority and under the authority of Executive Order 20-03, OREGON AGING AND PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES (APD) has [adopted a strict visitor restriction policy](#) for licensed Nursing Facilities(NF),Residential CareFacilities (RCF),and Assisted Living Facilities (ALF). Visitors are restricted to essential individuals, which has been defined to include:
 - Staff employed by facility;
 - Outside medical personnel;
 - Vendors;
 - Adult Protective Services staff;
 - Licensing/ Survey staff;
 - Long Term Care Ombudsman and Deputies (not volunteers);
 - Friends or family members visiting during end-of-life stages;and
 - Friends or family who are essential for the individual’s emotional well-being and care(limited to two per resident).

- The OREGON DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES has identified an oversight team to review all nursing, assisted living and residential care communities statewide, including those providing memory care, beginning today. The assessment will focus on pandemic response planning and infection control procedures.

- ➤ FEMA activated the National Business Emergency Operations Center (NBEOC) on March 4. The NBEOC is a two-way clearinghouse for public-sector and private-sector stakeholders to exchange information during an incident. The NBEOC has [an active dashboard](#) with resources and meeting links.
