

Multnomah County Sauvie Island/Multnomah Channel Rural Area Plan and Transportation System Plan Update Community Advisory Committee Interest Form

Multnomah County is beginning an update to the Sauvie Island/Multnomah Channel Rural Area Plan and Transportation System Plan. The plans will inform area policies, zoning code updates and transportation improvements for a 20 plus year planning horizon.

The county is forming a Community Advisory Committee (CAC) comprised of community stakeholders representing a variety of interests and viewpoints. The CAC is charged with informing the County decision makers (Planning Commission and Board of County Commissioners) on the policies and priorities that will comprise the final plans.

The planning effort is in response to a scoping effort completed in the spring of 2013 that resulted in a recommendation to update the plans (see https://multco.us/simc-planning). The CAC will be involved in a variety of topics including but not limited to, promotional activities and events on Exclusive Farm Use lands, agri-tourism, permitting at moorages and marinas, traffic and roads, bike facilities, recreation, wildlife and habitat protections, and outdoor mass gatherings. Policy choices will be made within the context of existing State, Federal, and County policies, laws and initiatives. Guidance will be provided by County Staff, a Technical Advisory Committee (TAC), the County Planning Commission, and the County Board of Commissioners as appropriate.

Multnomah County is seeking volunteers to participate on the CAC. The project is expected to run for 10 months with a goal of being completed by June 2014.

Committee member duties

Community input is a key value for Multnomah County leaders in helping to shape and inform decisions. Committee members will be expected to act fairly in representing the interests of their area or group independent of personal views, and seek input on issues as they arise in the process.
