## **Updates from outside the County**

### **State**

- **Oregon Health Authority** released updated modeling data. The model estimates the number of people who are likely to have COVID-19 and need hospital services in Oregon over the next 6 weeks, assuming different nonpharmaceutical interventions are implemented. It paints a somewhat hopeful story of the potential impact of continued social distancing and stay-at-home practices for Oregon.
