- >The regional [Interactive COVID-19 dashboard](#) is available beginning today. This web based collection of data, graphs, and tables allows the public to view the number of COVID cases, demographics, most common symptoms, hospitalization rates by age, etc. it was unveiled during a live Facebook video presentation including an American Sign Language Interpreter.
- >Continuing to answer calls from 211info, trained 5 people on work tasks, working to update communications to prepare for donation and volunteer calls and emails.
- **On Monday, March 30**, Prosper Portland and partners launched the first phase of the Small Business Relief Fund to provide relief to approximately 150-200 small businesses in Portland. Using \$1 million in general fund dollars allocated by the City Council, the fund will provide small grants of \$2,000-\$10,000 to businesses impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. - >Every Tuesday at 9am, the Liaison Sector Leaders have a meeting to share EOC updates, public information updates, and liaison activities updates.
- >The liaison unit comprises 23 sector liaisons. These liaisons support community members by providing education and resources. They also listen to their members and elevate concerns, issues, and creative ideas to the EOC. This hub and spoke approach allows us to reach over 2,463 unique individuals.
- >On March 30, the Residential Facilities Liaison hosted a webinar for Behavioral Health Residential Facilities owners and providers to which offered COVID-19 Health Guidance. There were 85 participants on the webinar.
- >The Culturally Specific Communities Liaisons are holding a Communities of Color call on Thursdays 2-3pm.

- ➤ Business Liaisons participate on the FEMA Regional Grocer calls each Wednesday from 11am-Noon.

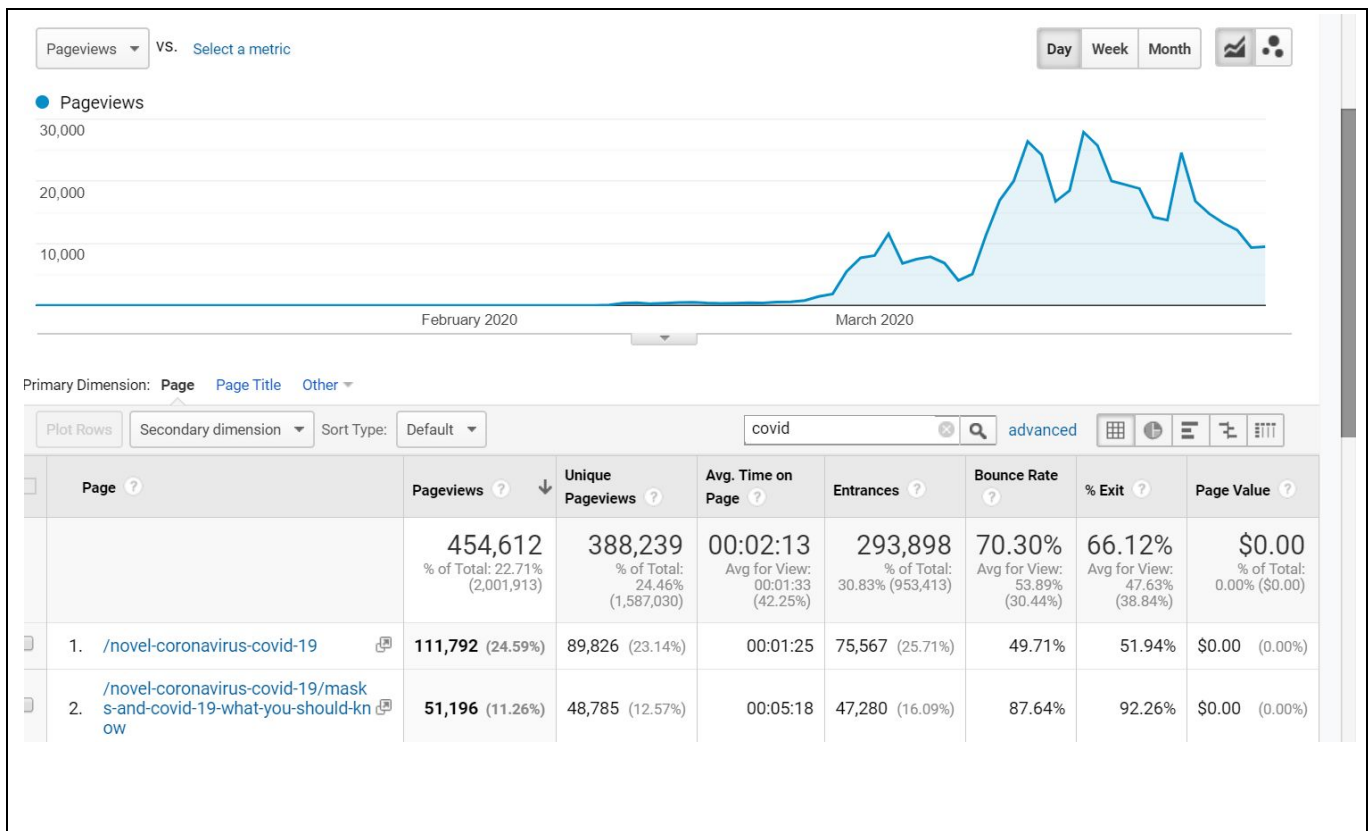
