<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • > Multnomah County hosts an updated website showing which County services/buildings are open or closed. • > Planning for additional medical motel & Social Distancing Shelter capacity. • > Portland Parks & Recreation (PP&R) is managing the installation of 1,850 signs at closed Parks per Executive Order. PP&R is keeping 54 designated Park public restrooms open, stocking them with soap, and ordering installation of 54 porta-potties and handwashing stations at the same locations for night use. New night Park Security patrols will be implemented after porta-potties and handwashing stations have been installed.

- **On Monday, March 30**, Prosper Portland and partners launched the first phase of the Small Business Relief Fund to provide relief to approximately 150-200 small businesses in Portland. Using \$1 million in general fund dollars allocated by the City Council, the fund will provide small grants of \$2,000-\$10,000 to businesses impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Liaison updates

Liaisons with subject-matter expertise have been identified to support community organizations, businesses, and agencies and are meeting weekly. Liaisons are listed below and are available to members of their respective sectors. The liaison unit comprises 23 sector liaisons. These liaisons support community members by providing education and resources. They also listen to their members and elevate creative ideas and any questions to the EOC. Over 2,463 people participate in the liaison program and help spread accurate information throughout our community and beyond.

Regularly Scheduled Calls:

- Every Tuesday at 9am, the **Liaison Sector Leaders** have a meeting to share updates related to the EOC, public information, and activities.
- The **Culturally Specific Communities Liaisons** are holding a Communities of Color call on Thursdays 2-3pm.
- **Business Liaisons** participate on the FEMA Regional Grocer calls each Wednesday from 11am-Noon.
- The **School & Childcare Liaison** is holding daily 1pm calls with public K-12 school, a weekly call on Wednesdays at 11am with private K-12 schools, as well as communicating daily with child care providers through email.


