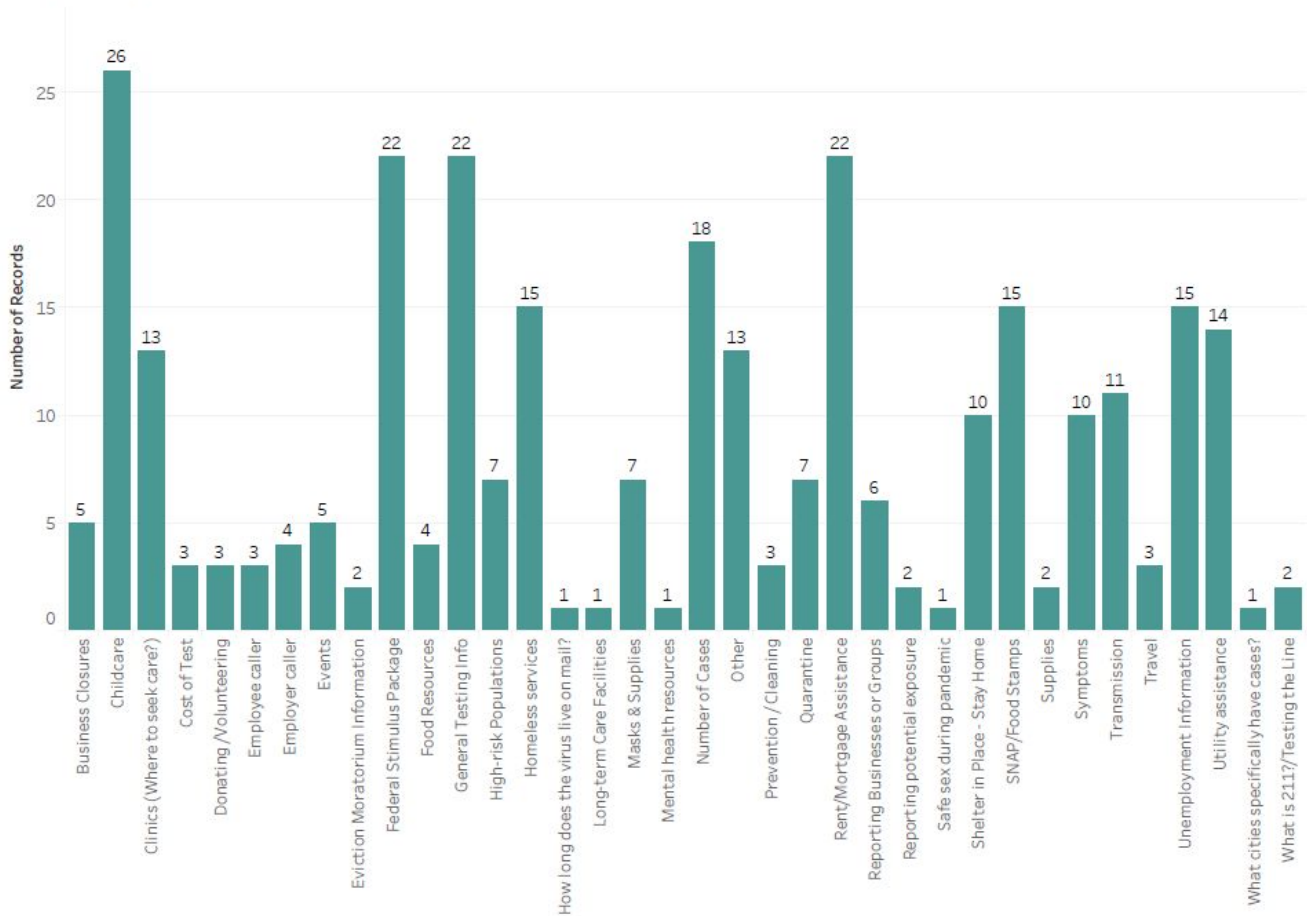
Multnomah County Situation Report

- ➤ Physical Distancing Shelters (to reduce the capacity of existing shelters) are currently serving 224 guests. Medical Motels - for shelter guests with undiagnosed respiratory ailments - are currently serving 37 guests.
- ➤ An American Sign Language (ASL) interpreter has been identified for Spanish press events and video resources for deaf and hard of hearing Spanish speaking community members.
- ➤ A brochure was produced to give patients NOT being transported by Emergency Medical Services (EMS) *Attachment is included with this report*
- ➤ The county's EOC continues to enhance safety protocol and practices.
- ➤ The White House has released its "Opening up America" Approach, and announced task force members today. Please see the links for more information on the [Members to serve on Task Force](#) and [outline of the plan](#)
- ➤ Prosper Portland awarded 235 Small Business Relief Fund Grants. It received 8,800 eligible applicants. Fifty-two percent of the awards were made to women of color. More demographic data is available by visiting the [Prosper Portland](#) data dashboard.
- ➤ Today Portland Parks & Recreation announced that they have [cancelled](#) all outdoor movies, concerts this summer.
- ➤ Today the Portland Police Bureau, Portland Fire & Rescue, and the Bureau of Emergency Communications hosted a [parade of public safety vehicles](#) by Portland hospitals to thank frontline medical staff at hospitals throughout the city.
- ➤ Today the City of Portland opened the first of three temporary Outdoor Emergency Shelters. The City has provided each location 45 tents. Tents are placed on platforms and include cots. Shelter residents will be able to store personal belongings, including their own tents and sleeping bags, while staying at the camp. Each site includes portable bathrooms and hand-washing stations. Hot meals will be provided by local nonprofits. [Read more about this effort here.](#)

Liaison updates

Liaisons with subject-matter expertise have been identified to support community organizations, businesses, and agencies and are meeting weekly. Liaisons are listed below and are available to members of their respective sectors. Requests for additional sectors to be created that are not covered by the established liaisons can be sent to the Liaison Group Supervisor. **If you are interested in serving as a liaison, please contact the Liaison Unit Leader.** Please note that the cost for non-county staff interested and able to fill vacant roles will be the responsibility of their organization.

The liaison unit comprises 23 sector liaisons. These liaisons support community members by providing education and resources. They also listen to their members and elevate creative ideas and any questions to the EOC. Over 6,597 people participate in the liaison program and help spread accurate information throughout our community and beyond.

Regularly Scheduled Calls:

- Every Tuesday at 9am, the **Liaison Sector Leaders** have a meeting to share updates related to the EOC, public information, and activities.
- The **Culturally Specific Communities Liaisons** are holding a Communities of Color call on Thursdays 2-3pm.
- **Business Liaisons** participate on the FEMA Regional Grocer calls each Wednesday from 11am-Noon.
- The **School & Childcare Liaison** joins 1 pm calls on Tuesdays and Thursdays with public K-12 schools, hosts a weekly call on Wednesdays at 11 am with private K-12 schools, as well as communicating daily with child care providers through email and as needed with higher education.

Aging & Disabilities, Veteran Services, Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities

- Facilitating weekly conference calls with community non-profits who are delivering services to older adults

Food and Hospitality Liaison Liaison

- Our liaison in conjunction with other County Health Inspectors has done outreach to more than 3,000 food and hospitality providers to discuss the latest updates about COVID-19.

Pharmacy Liaison

- Participating in weekly calls with state and pharmacy leadership.

Schools Liaison

- In light of the announcement that Oregon schools will be closed for the remainder of the school year, Oregon Department of Education released Graduation Pathways 2020 guidance in the [Distance Learning for All Guidance](#).
