## MCEMS ADMINISTRATIVE RULES PROPOSED CHANGES: JUNE 8, 2020

## **RATIONALE**

MCEMS seeks to maintain consistency with the current Multnomah County Ambulance Service Plan and update our administrative rules to clarify criteria used to define an ambulance.

## ADMINISTRATIVE RULES EMS-120 Ambulance License criteria

	transportation of persons who are ill or injured or who have disabilities, but
	excluding those motor vehicles fitted and equipped for just non-emergency wheelchair transport;
D	. It is configured and equipped to carry a stretcher; or
<u>E</u>	It otherwise appears to be an ambulance because it is staffed with EMS personnel and equipment and supplies regularly used by EMS personnel, the services rendered by the personnel associated with the vehicle are consistent with services provided by EMS personnel, or the vehicle contains any markings giving an impression it is used for EMS.

Stretcher Cars- Prohibited in Multnomah County

The use of a stretcher car, as defined below, is prohibited in Multnomah County. It is unlawful to provide supine or recumbent transport by any vehicle other than an ambulance.

A stretcher car means any car, van or vehicle configured and equipped to carry a patient in the supine, recumbent or reclining position (no more than forty-five degrees reclining), with or without a person, other than the driver, attending to the patient or staffed by someone not licensed at the EMT level.
