

Where Can I Get Tested?

Multnomah County East County Health Center is offering COVID-19 tests for people with symptoms on Mondays and Thursdays.

Where: East County Health Center Parking Lot at **600 NE 8th Street in Gresham**

When: Mondays and Thursdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:45 p.m.

**Call 503-988-8939 to make an appointment and reserve your spot.
Wait times could be long if you show up without an appointment.**

For those that can't make it to East County Health Center next week:

If you have insurance you can contact your provider to request a test.

If you don't have insurance the following free test sites are open to all those with symptoms of the virus, but are also prioritizing:

- People *without* health insurance
- People *without* a regular health care provider
- People of color

OHSU Mobile Drive Through & Walk Up Testing Sites

*OHSU offers drive-through testing for people with COVID-19 symptoms.
Appointments are not necessary. You will be screened for symptoms when you arrive.*

Walgreens Testing Sites

To get COVID-19 testing at Walgreens locations you must:

- Have an active email and phone number. This is required to get information about testing and your test results.

What to Expect From Your COVID-19 Test

The test involves a nasal swab that goes in quite far, so you will feel some brief discomfort. If your child is getting tested you may be asked to help hold them. We encourage you to go first and show them it will be okay.

Getting your COVID-19 Test Results

- If your results are positive, the Multnomah County Health Department will contact you.
- If your results are negative, the Oregon Health Authority will contact you.
- You have a legal right to your medical records and can call your provider or the location you were tested to ask for your test results to be mailed to you.

If you test positive for COVID-19

If your test is positive, we'll assume you have an infection now and are contagious to other people.

Even if you don't have symptoms, please:

- Stay separate from others until:
 - You have no fever for 3 days;
 - Your symptoms improve; **AND**
 - At least 10 days have passed since your first symptoms.
- Have other members in your household stay home for 10 days as well.

You'll get a call from a public health worker who will give you information about what your test results mean, how to protect yourself, your family, friends and co-workers until you are not contagious anymore. They can also help you figure out what kind of support you need to isolate yourself and can connect you to organizations that can help with other resources and services you may need, like groceries, financial support, help with rent, or other essential items. They can help!

Here is what to expect:

- To protect your privacy, they will ask you to confirm your name and birth date.
- They will ask you about the people you have been in close contact with in the recent days.
- They will **never** ask you to provide other personal information (social security number, documentation status, or financial information).

If you test negative for COVID-19

No contact or action is required.

Continue to stay at home and practice physical distancing when making essential trips.
