Program Description

To ensure that voters in East Multnomah County who have not yet voted using ranked choice voting (RCV) are prepared to vote in the County's first RCV contests in November 2026, the Elections Division will offer grants to non-profit and culturally-specific community organizations in East County to provide targeted voter education and outreach about RCV.

Grantee organizations will provide targeted education and outreach through: material dissemination, community education events, and peer-to-peer outreach. County Elections Division staff will collaborate with grantees, providing educational materials, offering train-the-trainer sessions on how to teach about RCV, and providing translation support to ensure that materials are provided in people's home languages.
