RESOLUTION NO. 2020-060

Approving an Amendment to Increase the Contract Amount for Contract DCS-CNSTR-10262-2019 with Murraysmith, Inc., to continue construction engineering support services for the NW Cornelius Pass Road project.

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners Finds:

- a. The Board, acting as the Multnomah County Public Contract Review Board (PCRB) and pursuant to PCRB Rule 48-0320(5), must approve contract price increases beyond 33 percent of the original contract price.
- b. The County awarded a contract to Murraysmith, Inc. (Consultant) for \$173,564 on February 12, 2019 for construction support services for the NW Cornelius Pass Road (US30 NW Kaiser Road) Improvement Project (Project). Amendment 1 executed on May 6, 2020 increased the maximum amount payable to \$225,879. A second amendment will increase the maximum amount payable to \$399,490. Board approval is required because the maximum payable now exceeds the originally approved contract amount by more than 33%.
- c. This increase is necessary because construction delays during 2019 make a second season of construction necessary, which in turn requires continued construction engineering support by Murraysmith.
- d. This Amendment will compensate the Consultant for work remaining to complete the Project.
- e. This Amendment is in accordance with the requirements of Public Contract Review Board Rule 48-0320(5).

The Multnomah County Board of Commissioners, acting as the Multnomah County Public Contract Review Board, hereby Resolves:

1. To amend and increase the total amount of Contract Number DCS-CNSTR-10262-2019 with Murraysmith, Inc., by an additional \$225,926 for a total contract amount of \$399,490 for the NW Cornelius Pass Road Project.

REVISED EXHIBIT A - STATEMENT OF WORK

Delete Revised Exhibit A Statement of Work, Section E, Tasks 1.6, 1.8, 1.9, 1.11, 1.12, 1.14, 2.1, and 2.2 of the executed Contract and replace with the following:

E. TASKS, DELIVERABLES and SCHEDULE

Task 1.6 Consultation During Construction

Consultant shall provide consultation and technical services regarding design issues raised during construction of the Project. Consultant shall clarify construction contract documents and provide written responses to Requests for Information (RFIs). In addition, Consultant shall provide support services to facilitate electronic data transfer to the CC. Support will depend on the CC's needs for construction staking layout, but is anticipated to include generation of electronic grade reports from the design surface at the frequency/location requested and/or review of files provided by the CC for machine control grading. The design consultation will occur only as required and may be ongoing throughout the CA/CEI Services and the Project.

Upon request of the CC or Agency during construction, Consultant shall:

- Clarify construction contract documents.
- Respond to field inquiries.
- Engage the services of the Professional Of Record ("POR") on all matters involving design changes.
- Provide support to electronic data translation to the field for use in construction.
- Provide supplemental field inspection services at the request of the Agency.

Consultant shall also coordinate with Agency on up to one (1) minor Federal Aid Highway Programmatic Biological Opinion (FAHP) change that shall not require a FAHP Change Request Form during construction. These changes will be incorporated into the FAHP Project Completion Report in Task 1.10.

Assumptions: For budgetary purposes, assume up to thirty (30) RFI's and thirty (30) informal (phone call or email) inquiries. Also, assume up to ten (10) field trips.

Deliverables:

Consultant shall provide:

- Verbal response to phone or in person inquiries from the Agency. E-mail or written documentation (electronic and one (1) hard copy) of responses to CC inquiries to Agency.
- Attendance at field visits as requested by Agency and follow up Site Visit Reports (electronic or one (1) hard copy); and
- Written notes (electronic) regarding minor FAHP change communication with Agency.

Schedule:

- Verbal responses within one (1) day, unless agreed to by both Parties.
- E-mail or written responses courtesy response within one (1) day to acknowledge receipt of request, then full response within three (3) business days, or as agreed to by both Parties.
- Field visits as determined by Agency.
- Site Visit Reports within one (1) day of the Field Visit or a timeframe agreed to by both Parties.
- Written notes regarding minor FAHP change within three (3) business days of communication and resolution with Agency.

Task 1.8 Claim(s) Support - (Contingency)

If authorized by PM, Consultant shall provide support to the County to review and respond to claims submitted by the CC as specified in the Specifications in Section 00199 - Disagreements, Protests and Claims. Consultant tasks for claim(s) support may include but are not limited to:

- Prepare memoranda and supporting documentation (photo logs, inspection reports, memos, drawings, etc.) related to claims;
- Provide consultation related to claims (in person, via telephone or email);
- Attend claim resolution meetings; and
- Prepare a claim decision in conformance with the requirements of the Specifications in 00199.40(b).

Assumptions: This task assumes no more than 96 hours for claim(s) support. Assume up to 2 claim submittals, each requiring 2 staff to do 2 days of preparation and attend up to 2 all-day meetings for each claim, plus Consultant Principal and PM reviews, and clerical assistance.

Deliverables:

The deliverables for claim(s) support may include but are not limited to providing;

- Memoranda and supporting documentation (photo logs, inspection reports, memos, drawings, etc.) related to claims;
- Consultation related to claims (in person, via telephone or email);
- Attendance at claim resolution meetings; and
- Claim decision that satisfies the Specifications in 00199.40(b).

Task 1.9 Quality Control Monitoring (Field-Tested Materials)

Consultant shall retain a material testing firm (separate from the CC's QC firm) who will perform all Quality Assurance (QA) verification and independent assurance (IA) testing.

Consultant shall document the Non-Field Tested and Field-Tested materials incorporated into the Project. The Agency will conduct submittal reviews of quality documentation (except those described by Task 16.3) and complete Field Inspection Reports (FIRs) as required by the ODOT Construction Manual, Chapter 12C-Quality and the Non-Field Tested Materials Acceptance Guide. Consultant shall log the FIR's and other supporting quality documentation into the applicable Test Summary and keep up to date and available for review by the County. Consultant shall maintain the Non-Field Tested Materials Test Summary (Test Summary "A") as detailed in the ODOT Construction Manual

Consultant shall monitor the CC's QC Program. One or more Consultant staff shall perform the Quality Control Compliance Specialist (QCCS) functions as defined in the QCCS Handbook and ODOT's Quality Assurance Program, which is in Section 2 of the ODOT Manual of Field Test Procedures. Consultant staff fulfilling the role of the QCCS shall be experienced in all areas of field testing and documentation, and be certified by the ODOT's Technician Certification Program for the specific tests being monitored.

The following are the approved Technician Certifications currently in place in the Technician Certification Program:

- Certified Aggregate Technician (CAgT)
- Certified Embankment and Base Technician (CEBT)
- Certified Density Technician (CDT)
- Certified Asphalt Technician I (CAT-I)
- Certified Asphalt Technician II (CAT-II)
- Certified Mix Design Technician (CMDT)
- Quality Control Technician (QCT)
- Concrete Control Technician (CCT)
- Concrete Strength Testing Technician (CSTT)

Consultant shall:

- Review and monitor the CC's documentation for the quality of all materials incorporated into the Project.
- Verify that all materials furnished and placed on the Project comply with the approved specifications;
- Certify that the documentation confirms that all materials comply with Construction Contract requirements.
- Maintain the Test Summary for Non-Field Tested Materials and Field-Tested Materials (Test Summary "A", "B" and "B-QA") as detailed in the ODOT Construction Manual, Chapter 12B Quality.
- Identify and monitor CC's quality control technicians and require proper and current certification(s), and require that proper testing frequencies and procedures are being followed. Monitoring must be done by Consultant staff experienced in all areas of field testing and documentation and certified by ODOT's Technician Certification Program for the specific tests being monitored.
- Take appropriate action if CC's quality contract technicians do not have proper or current certifications or if proper testing frequencies and procedures are not being followed.
- Obtain, review and compile all required Project quality documentation in accordance with the ODOT Construction Manual and the construction contract documents.
- Communicate with the County's Quality Assurance Coordinator (QAC) to facilitate timeliness and efficiency in the verification and IA testing work and compliance with all requirements of the ODOT Manual of Field Test Procedures and contract documents.
- Compare CC's QC test results to Consultant's verification test results to verify they are within IA parameters.
- Take appropriate action and work with County to resolve any discrepancies between CC's QC
 test results and Consultant verification test results.
- Prepare quality price adjustments as necessary for materials.

Deliverables:

Consultant shall provide:

- Field Inspection Reports (FIRs) and Non-Field Test Summaries Maintained with Project files throughout the Project and available for Agency review as needed; and
- Field-Test Summaries and other Project field-tested materials quality documentation Make available for Agency review throughout the Project.

Task 1.11 FAHP Construction and Post-Construction Inspections and Reporting

This task involves conducting FAHP Programmatic construction and post-construction inspections and reporting. Consultation for the FAHP Environmental Inspections shall conform to the FAHP User's Guide.

For Services under Task 1.11, the Consultant is the Professional of Record for the work, which shall be executed by a qualified Biologist.

The Consultant shall conduct two (2) environmental inspection site visits during the construction phase of the Project and prepare the draft and final FAHP Environmental Inspection reports. The timing of FAHP environmental inspection site visits shall correspond with construction stages that include high risk environmental items and best management practices. The qualified FAHP Consultant shall review high risk items related to the following:

- Erosion and Sediment Control
- Pollution Control/ Containment

- Fish and Wildlife Protection
- Native materials designated for avoidance
- Cleared Vegetation
- In-water work area isolation
- In-water work [e.g., bank stabilization, pile driving]
- Containment practices and structures

The Consultant shall conduct two (2) project completion site visits and prepare the draft and final FAHP Project Completion reports summarizing actions that occurred during construction as they relate to the Endangered Species Act (ESA) consultation¹. The timing of the Project completion site visit shall be within two (2) weeks of final installation of Project components relating to the ESA consultation.

The Consultant shall also coordinate with the County on up to one (1) minor FAHP change during construction.

Assumptions:

- This task assumes three (3) site visits for environmental site inspection and two (2) site visits for Project completion inspection by one (1) qualified FAHP Consultant. Each site visit will be up to 6 hours, including travel and preparation, for a total of 12 hours.
- The draft FAHP Environmental Inspection and Project Completion Reports will each require up to 14 hours by one (1) qualified FAHP Consultant, for a total of 28 hours.
- The final FAHP Environmental Inspection and Project Completion Reports will each require up to 3 hours of additional review, coordination, and editing by one (1) senior, qualified FAHP Consultant; and up to 2 hours of review by one (1) senior Environmental Scientist, for a total of 10 hours.
- The As-Built drawings can be handwritten markups of the plan sheets.
- Additional annual monitoring reports (if required) will be prepared by Agency.
- The minor FAHP change will not require a FAHP Change Request Form and will be incorporated into the FAHP Project Completion Report.

Deliverables:

Consultant shall provide:

- 3 Draft Environmental Inspection Report (electronic);
- 3 Final Environmental Inspection Report (electronic);
- 2 Draft Project Completion Report (electronic); and
- 2 Final Project Completion Report (electronic).

Schedule:

- The draft Environmental Inspection Report is due no later than two (2) weeks after each inspection. The final Environmental Inspection Report is due no later than two (2) weeks after receiving final comments from the Agency.
- The draft Project Completion Report shall be submitted to the Agency within 30 calendar days of the Project completion site visit. The final Project Completion Report is due no later than two (2) weeks after receiving final comments from the Agency.

Task 1.12 Public Information (Contingency)

Consultant shall assist the Agency in planning and implementing public information tasks up to a limited number of hours. Tasks to be determined by Agency and may include:

¹ FHWA statewide programmatic Endangered Species Act (ESA) Section 7 consultation and Magnuson Stevens Act (MSA) consultation with the National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS)

- Attending Project strategy meetings;
- Assistance planning, staffing and documenting public meeting(s);
- Video production;
- Graphic design;
- Reviewing and providing input on public information materials; and
- Develop social media strategy, content and campaign schedule.

Consultant shall attend two (2) strategy meetings with the Project team prior to completing the assigned task.

The Agency will be responsible for printing and distribution of public meeting notices, distribution of project videos and ordering social media ads.

Deliverables:

- Attendance at two (2) strategy meetings.
- Deliverables from above list to be determined by Agency, based on Project's needs and limited by budget allocated for this Consultant.

Task 1.14 - As-Constructed Plans (Contingency)

Consultant shall prepare as-constructed plans for Contract plans. The Agency shall provide as-built redlines and shall review the incorporated revisions. As-constructed plans shall be in conformance with the following reference documents as applicable to the Project:

- 1. Roadway Plans, ODOT Contract Plans Development Guide, Vol. 1 Chapter 16.
- 2. Traffic Plans:
 - Sign Plans, ODOT Traffic Sign Design Manual.

The following clarifications or exceptions or both to the above reference documents apply to Consultantprepared as-constructed plans:

- For all traffic plans, Consultant shall prepare as-constructed PDF's and AutoCAD file;
- As-constructed plans must be reviewed and approved by the POR prior to submittal to the County; and
- The submittal and distribution requirements are specified in the "Deliverables" section of this task.

Deliverables and Schedule:

- Roadway Plans Consultant shall submit stamped and signed as-constructed plans within 30 calendar days of issuance of Third Notification as follows:
 - Electronic files package: AutoCAD file and PDF file output that includes all roadway plan sheets showing red-line as-constructed markups; and
 - PDF plan sheets: (11 inch x 17 inch size) Submit 1 final set to the County.
- Traffic Plans (Traffic Signal, Traffic Sign, or Illumination) Consultant shall submit stamped and signed as-constructed traffic plans (i.e. traffic signal, traffic sign, or illumination plans) within 30 calendar days of issuance of Third Notification as follows:
 - Electronic files package: AutoCAD file and PDF file output that shows all red-line asconstructed markups of plan sheets;
 - Use file naming convention as shown in the applicable manuals referenced above;
 and
 - o PDF plan sheets: (11 inch x 17 inch size) Submit 1 final set to the County.

Task 2.1 - Construction Survey

Consultant shall provide on-call construction survey support to the County for the Project Consultant's licensed land surveyor who is responsible for land surveying practices including conformance to all state statutes pertaining to survey and land boundary laws for this Project. These statutes include, but are not limited to, the following state statutes: ORS Chapter 92, Subdivisions and Partitions, ORS Chapter 93, Conveyancing and Recording, ORS Chapter 209, County Surveyors and map requirements, and ORS Chapter 672 Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors. Consultant shall:

- Supply a two-person survey crew for various construction support needs. Anticipated survey
 needs are verifying the limits of contaminated soil, quantity surveys, as-built surveys, and
 verifying construction stakes.
- Provide reports and/or drawings for each survey task. If requested, Consultant will provide raw field data, field notes, and cad drawings.

Assumptions:

- Consultant will have access to the survey site; and
- Consultant will be notified 48 hours prior to each survey request.

Deliverables:

Consultant shall provide:

- Reports and/or drawings for each survey task; and
- Raw field data, field notes, and cad drawings, if requested by County.

Task 2.2 - Post-Construction Record of Survey (Contingency)

If County agrees and authorizes this task via email NTP, Consultant will provide Post-Construction Record of Survey services for the Project. Consultant shall:

- Verify the position of the existing monuments and determine which monuments are disturbed/destroyed.
- Set monuments to replace the disturbed/destroyed monuments.
- Prepare and file a post-construction record of survey with Multnomah County surveyor's office.




