**Historical Context:** ACHIEVE (Action Communities for Health, Innovation and Environmental Change) Coalition has laid the foundation for Racial and Ethnic Approaches to Community Health (REACH) since 2009. A group of multi-sectoral partners collectively envisioned: ending health inequities in chronic diseases for African Americans/Blacks in Multnomah County . The coalition advocates the use of communication, policy, systems and environmental (PSE) change strategies to increase access to

healthy foods, improve community design by connecting safe and accessible places for physical activity, offering tobacco cessation programming and breastfeeding support in the places people live, work, worship and study.

**Acknowledgement Statement:** Multnomah County sits on the ancestral homelands of the Multnomah, Kathlamet, Clackamas, Tualatin Kalapuya, Molalla, bands of the Chinook, and many others who made their homes along the Columbia River.
