Stafford, Elizabeth A. - 1912

Nothing was found in the bio index, bio card catalog, OHS Quarterly Index, or vertical file. The Oregonian of June 17, 1915 carried an obit for E. A. Stafford, who died in June 1915. She was a pioneer of 1852. Her husband died on July 6, 1900. She was born in Terre Haute, IN in 1847 and came to Oregon with her parents across the plains. In 1865 she married Andrew Jackson Stafford. They had 15 children, 11 of whom lived past childhood: S. M. Stafford, Mrs. Henry Richardson, Mrs. H. J. Wallace, Al and Jessie Stafford, Mrs. Arthur Dowsett, Chester and Everett (Troutdale), John, Mrs. Wm. Kane, and Mrs. I. T. Buxton (Troutdale). The 1900 Soundex listed Elizabeth Stafford as the household head, and she was born in IN in March 1848 and was now living in the Powell Valley area. All her children were born in OR: John (Oct. 1874), Everett (Oct. 1876), Etta (March 1879), Alfred (Sept. 1880), Pearl (July 1882), Florence (July 1884), Jesse (Oct. 1886), and Chester (May 1992). DR for Elizabeth Ann: 6/10/15 (Mult Co).

Stafford, Blanche I. - 1930-1942

Nothing was found in the bio index, bio card catalog, OHS Quarterly Index, or vertical file, or newspaper index.

Stafford, Everett - 1921-1930

Nothing was found in the bio index, bio card catalog, OHS Quarterly Index, or vertical file or newspaper index. He is probably Elizabeth's son (see above), born in Oct. 1876 in OR. DR for Everett: 3/6/47 (Portland); nothing located in the Gresham Outlook.

Baker, Occana - 1897-1907

Nothing was found in the bio index, bio card catalog, or vertical file. There was an item in Vol. 38 of the OR Historical Quarterly under "Necrology" (p. 242) that said Oceanna Holtgrieve Baker died in April 1937. The Oregonian, April 20, 1937 had an obit for Oceanna Baker. She died in April 1937 and lived on NE Sandy Blvd. Holtgrieve was her maiden name. She was the daughter of pioneers of 1850, and her father was Henry Holtgrieve. The Holtgrieve house was on the banks of the Columbia River (site is now occupied by Alderwood Country Club). She married Alfred A. Baker in 1879; he died in 1907 at the Melrose farm, Troutdale, where they lived. She then moved to Sandy Blvd. Her sons were Emery E. of Roseburg, Ralph O. of Troutdale, sister was Mrs. A. L. Miller, brother Charles Holtgrieve, and 3 grandchildren.

The Journal of April 20, 1937 said she was born Oct. 10, 1859 and had lived in Portland since 1907. It said her sons were Emery E. and Ralph <u>D.</u>, and that she had a daughter, Nellie Hopkins of Troutdale. DR for Oceanna [Alfred]: 4/17/37 (Portland).
