Beekeeping enclosure requirements

- Provide a safe, sturdy enclosure that has good air flow and making sure to provide a water source. Contact your local beekeeping association if you need support in building a bee enclosure.
- Beehives should be a minimum of 15 feet away from neighbors.
- Structures and enclosure must be at least 3' from property lines and 10' from the front property line.
- Beehives should be placed in areas where they are secure from trespassers, such as curious neighbors or children.
- A 6-foot high barrier is needed if beehives are less than 10 feet from residences, sidewalks, streets, public buildings and public areas.
- Barrier must extend 10 feet in each direction beyond the apiary so bees are forced to fly at an elevation of at least 6 feet OR the hive is 10ft above ground level.

Keeping bees

To keep bees in the City of Portland, you need to follow City of Portland Code Title 13: <u>portlandoregon.gov/</u> <u>citycode/</u>

» If a person owns or keeps 5 or more beehives, they need to be registered with the state. <u>oregon.gov/oda/</u> <u>programs/IPPM/InsectsSpiders/</u> <u>Pages/BeesApiaries.aspx</u>



Multnomah County Code Enforcement makes sure beekeeping is done in a way that keeps Portland communities and bees safe.

» If you plan to keep bees, you must notify your neighbors within 150 feet of the beehive site.

Frequently asked questions

How many bees can I have on my lot?

Four beehives are allowed on any lot, or six beehives for lots 10,000 square feet or greater.

Are there any exceptions to the beekeeping regulations?

There are no limits for agricultural uses under Title 33 or for those with a conditional use permit via City Zoning.

Why do I need written permission from my neighbors to keep bees?

It is important that all neighbors are aware of the hive on your property, as some people are allergic to bees.

Do I need to register my beehives?

Yes, beekeepers with 5 or more hives are required to register with the Oregon Department of Agriculture (ODA).

Can I put a beehive on my property less than 15 feet away from my neighbor's house?

No, a beehive needs to be 15 feet away from a public walkways, streets, and other public areas and at least 3 feet from all property lines.

What do I do if I am concerned about the health of my beehive, or if I have other questions concerning beekeeping?
