

# BHD Investments for the Criminally and Legally Exposed

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### **Needs of the Community Served**

- Community restoration
- Behavioral health treatment, including medication access
- All levels of housing
- Peer support

## **Community Restoration**

- 50+ Community Consultations per month
  - Legal skills, case management, referral/linkage, basic need acquisition, housing navigation, system navigation, transportation assistance, medication support.

#### NEW:

 Expanding team to include additional an case manager, a discharge and treatment planner, care coordination and additional infrastructure.

#### **Behavioral Health Treatment**

Currently, Coordinated Diversion Services do not provide treatment, but connect individuals to community based treatment providers.

NEW: Bridge Team: 8 FTE to provide assessment, therapy, connection + telepsychiatry. CADC credential included.

NEW: Colocated staff in DA's Strategic Prosecution Program. Role will be dually certified (mental health and SUD).

NEW: Aid and Assist CATC treatment beds to support sub-acute treatment needs.

### **Residential Treatment**

- Support health and safety for individuals residing at Aid and Assist Site (Alta House, 5 beds)
- As of today, in 2023, 8.7% of Residential referrals are for individuals under a .370 order.
- ONGOING: Advocating for increase in Residential Treatment for Specialized Populations.

#### Housing - Stabilization Programs, Motels and Shelter

- Stabilization Treatment Programs
  - STP 10 bed
  - Glisan 10 bed
  - NEW: Karibu 14 bed STP for African American males
- NEW: Cultivating Community (36 room BH Motel)
- NEW: BHRC Shelter and Bridge

### **Peer Support**

- NEW: BHRC Day Center Opened December 5th
  - At full capacity, will serve 150 individuals
- NEW: BHRC Shelter and Bridge Housing Programs opening soon!
  - 33 shelter and 19 Bridge beds
- NEW: Culturally specific peer outreach pilot
- NEW: Bridge Treatment team contracted peers
  - Supporting at risk and/or individuals with high exposure to legal/criminal system and high utilization of crisis services.
