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#### SUMMARY

**Brandy Steffen, JLA Public Involvement,** reviewed the agenda, meeting protocols and meeting purpose, as well as two engagement events the project team participated in during the fall.

**Megan Neill, Multnomah County**, reviewed the CDAG process moving forward in 2025. She shared the CDAG workplan and discussion topics for the remaining CDAG meetings.

**Keith Brownlie, BEAM Architects,** provided CDAG members with an overview on the design progress. He highlighted type selection review, design continuity, west bridge, in-water piers and tower geometry.

**Elizabeth Johnson, HLB Lighting Design,** provided an overview of bridge lighting and options for CDAG members to consider including general bridge lighting needs, aesthetics, design constraints and opportunities. **Carol Mayer-Reed, Mayer/Reed,** guided the conversation back to the committee's guiding principles. **CDAG Members** shared their thoughts and questions.

**Megan Neill, Multnomah County,** shared an update on the Eastbank Esplanade. Multnomah County and the City of Portland made a joint decision to advance the Earthquake Ready Burnside Bridge Project without a ramp connection to the Eastbank Esplanade at this time. However, the County continues to meet with the City of Portland Parks and Recreation and the Portland Bureau of Transportation to identify potential solutions on connectivity in general. The County formed a workgroup of PBOT, Parks and County staff to look at connectivity and access to the Eastbank Esplanade.

**Cassie Davis, CD Consulting**, provided closing remarks and will be transitioning off this project after 10 years of dedicated work. **Stacy Thomas, HDR,** will be her replacement.
