# **Meeting 8 Summary**

The project team shared updates on the cost of the bridge options. Keith Brownlie from BEAM Architects provided preferences on design options and answered questions. The project team shared results from the online open house and survey. **Members reached 75% agreement to remove the Goalpost Tower and Braced Vertical Arch options.**

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# **SUMMARY**

**Brandy Steffen, JLA Public Involvement,** started the meeting with meeting protocols and reminded members to use the guiding principles for consideration of the bridge type options that will be discussed during today's discussion.

**Emily Miletich, Multnomah County,** presented a cost update for the different bridge type options and answered questions about the delta range.

**Keith Brownlie, BEAM Architects,** presented preferences on bridge types and key considerations, providing examples worldwide. Brownlie provided the architect's bridge type preferences.

**Sarah Hurwitz, Multnomah County,** presented on the summer outreach efforts and data from the public online open house and survey. The survey results revealed that the preferred bridge type among more than 19,000 participants was the Cable-Stay V-Tower, followed closely by the Tied Arch Basket-Handle and Unbraced Vertical Arch, followed by the Inverted Y.

**CDAG members** shared their reactions, thoughts and asked additional questions of the project team. The discussion included sharing preferences for Cable Stay or Tied Arch bridge types, cost comparisons and other bridge aesthetics as well as accessibility concerns. Members referred to the Guiding Principles document to guide their conversation and discussed removing two bridge options based on input from the survey results and architect feedback.

# **Decisions / Comments**

The group reached agreement (75% of members present agreed) to remove the Goalpost Tower and Braced Vertical Arch options.

Next week's meeting will discuss the remaining four options. CDAG members will work towards making a bridge-type recommendation.
