★ Oregon Special Needs GRANT PROGRAM -

 Open to any person with a disability for home or vehicle modifications, adaptive equipment or technology, communication devices or durable medical equipment needed to increase accessibility at home, work, school or in their community. The maximum Accessibility Grant award is \$2,000.

Disability Verification required

- SSI or SSDI benefit letter dated within 12 months prior to the grant application date
- First page of the person's ISP, IEP, BHP, or other verification of any disability services received
- Vendor purchase order, estimate, invoice or other documentation clearly showing the goods or services to be purchased and the vendor's contact information
- Proof of denial of payment (if applicable) for purchase of medical
 equipment or other items possibly covered by disability related benefits
- Letter from professional recommending the item or modification
