- What: Access **Discount Program** The Access Discount Program provides a discount on activity fees of up to 90%. The discount is valid for 12 months from the date of enrollment. No proof of income is required. City of Portland residents may choose the discount that works for them. You can use an Access Discount to reduce the price of the following:
 - Admission to recreation centers and pools
 - Classes, camps, swim lessons, and other registered activities
 - Preschool and after school programs
 - Personal training

The suggested income guidelines help determine if the Access Discount Program is right for you. Choose an Access Discount of 25, 50, 75, or 90% ongoing discount based on your financial need. Those with a lower income or higher number of family members may consider selecting a greater discount. **Examples-** Swim Lessons Youth camp at a community center

★ The Little Ducks Learning Project is a **pilot study** supporting Portland-area families of preschool-aged children (ages 3–6) with disabilities. We're recruiting families whose children have a diagnosed disability or are currently being evaluated. **Starting in January 2026**, families will complete pre- and post-test sessions (about 1.5 hours each) at the **UO Portland campus**. During the first visit, parents receive individualized training and a set of home learning materials—such as storybooks, board games, and routine-based activities—focused on either math or literacy/social communication. Families use these materials for 8 weeks, receive a \$150 stipend, and keep all materials after.
