Our grant program provides essential financial assistance to low-income Oregonians. Funding supports independence, mobility, and quality of life through:
 - Assistive technology and adaptive equipment – such as wheelchairs, hearing aids, prosthetics, and communication devices
 - Independent living tools – including therapeutic aids, hospital beds, and personal care equipment
 - Accessibility modifications – like home ramps, wheelchair lifts, and vehicle accessibility upgrades
 - Supportive nonprofit programs – offering direct services like accessible transportation, vocational support, or inclusive recreation
- Grants are capped at \$1,500 and may be awarded once every three years. All payments are made directly to vendors—never to individuals.

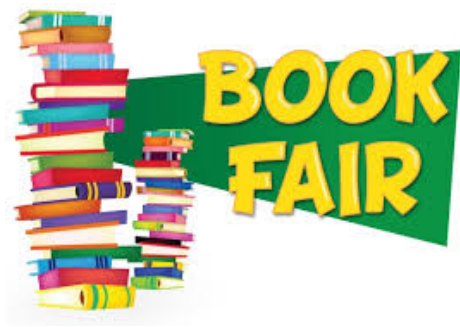

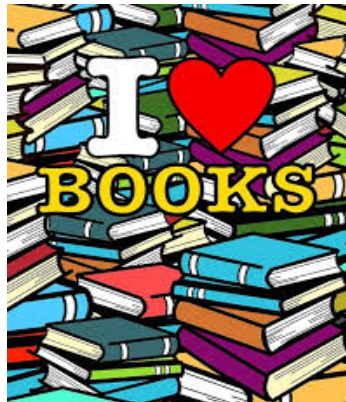
