

Who Can Register to Vote in Oregon?

- At least 16 years of age
- A citizen of the United States
- A resident of Oregon

How Do I Register to Vote?

1. Online at oregonvotes.gov/register
2. On paper with an [Oregon Voter Registration Card](#)
3. Automatically at the DMV - Oregon Motor Voter Act

Registration Deadlines

The Voter Registration Deadline is always 21 days before each election.

This is also the Party Choice Deadline.

You can register to vote anytime but in order to vote in the next election you have to register at least 21 days before Election Day.

Political Parties and Non-affiliated Voters

- Affiliated Voters select a party.
- Non-affiliated Voters choose not to select a party.

- The **Party Choice Deadline** is the same date as the Voter Registration Deadline.


Voter Rights and Assistance Services
