Definitions

What are criteria (interests and values)

- A principle or standard by which something may be judged or decided.

What are measures (information needs)

- Measures to quantify or qualitatively assess the performance or value of something relative to a given standard or principle.




4. Evaluation Criteria 101

Guiding Principles




Measurable at the level of design and information that will be available in this step



Help differentiate alternatives



Reflect input received to-date



Help inform the evaluation of alternatives and identification of a preferred alternative



4. Evaluation Criteria 101

Screening Process – Example Criteria & Measure

Criteria: Built Environment

Promote land use compatibility and minimize impacts to parks and historic resources.

Measure: To what extent does the option impact national historic resources and national register historic districts?

- Number of national register historic resources, including “contributing” resources, displaced or visually obstructed.
- Extent of the proposed transportation structures within the New Chinatown / Japantown Historic District and the Skidmore / Old Town Historic District.



4. Evaluation Criteria 101

Developing the criteria and measures

1. The Criteria – Interests and Values

By exploring our interests and values, we can then understand what is most important to the community

2. The Measures – Information Needs

Once we know what's important, we can then determine what information is needed to measures performance


