What Does the Department of Community Justice Do?

We develop evidence-based practices to help those who are at-risk for committing a crime, accused of a crime, in detention, or on parole, and those who have been impacted by criminal behavior.

We have three unique divisions: Adult Services (ASD), Juvenile Services (JSD) & Director's Office (DO).

The Volunteer Engagement Internship is part of the five-person Policy & Communications unit, which is situated in the Director's Office and serves all three divisions.

The Volunteer and Internship programs help connect community members and emerging professionals to service opportunities that support DCJ's operations and mission to: *Enhance community safety and reduce criminal activity by holding youth and adults accountable in a fair and just manner, assisting them to develop skills necessary for success, and <u>effectively</u> <u>using public resources</u>.*

Better Impact. To support the programmatic changes, The Volunteer Engagement Intern will create training materials, facilitate engagement exercises, and use innovative communication tools to reach diverse audiences and support their unique needs through the operational change.

Responsibilities in this role will include:

- Content Creation may include: flyers, flow charts, notices, newsletters, videos, etc.
- Stakeholder Engagement you will work collaboratively with multiple stakeholders to develop best practices for effective communication.
- Digital Change Management you will help educate and onboard volunteers into Multnomah County's new enterprise software for volunteer management, Better Impact.

- Learn people mapping skills and be able to identify engagement opportunities with multiple stakeholders.
