## Your Charge Can Result in Prison

### **If I am in custody:**

My interview will be in the jail where I am held.

### **If I am already out of custody:**

I will contact my lawyer as soon as possible to schedule the interview at a Probation Field Office near my home.

### **If I am released from jail before my interview:**

I will contact my lawyer to schedule the interview as soon as possible at a Probation Field Office near my home.

### **Finding my lawyer:**

Your lawyer's name is on your paperwork from arraignment court. If you cannot find the name, call: (503) 988-3987; or (503) 988-3235 ext 2.

## **Multnomah County Justice Reinvestment Process Interview Opportunities**

You have been charged with a crime that can send you to prison for more than one year.

You qualify for a new court process that **may** result in a probation sentence with community-based treatment and services instead of going to prison. This new process is called the Multnomah County Justice Reinvestment Process, or **MCJRP** for short.

If you want to be considered for the process, you must complete an interview through the Multnomah County Department of Community Justice as soon as you can.

This interview and the MCJRP process is designed to help you, your lawyer, the district attorney, and the judge, decide how your case should be handled, and what sentence and services you should receive.

- Your lawyer or the MCJRP Defense Coordinator can be in the interview with you.
- You will not talk about the facts of your case. You will talk about your past and current circumstances, as well as any treatment services you may need.
- Talk to your lawyer as soon as you can to schedule your interview.

Your participation in the MCJRP interview **does not** guarantee that you will receive probation. But you must participate if you want to be considered for probation through this process.
