DPSST reviewed the above-listed candidate's request to determine his eligibility to run for the office of Sheriff.

As of October 4, 2021, Derrick Peterson meets the eligibility requirements to be a candidate for election or appointment to the office of sheriff pursuant to ORS 206.015.

Derrick Peterson is not currently certified as a police officer by the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training. If elected or appointed, Mr. Peterson will need to become basic police certified within one year of taking office and a copy of the certification would need to be filed with the county clerk. The governing body shall declare the office of sheriff vacant if the Sheriff is not certified as a police officer within one year.

Eligibility Requirements

Per ORS 206.015 to be eligible to be a candidate for election or appointment to the office of Sheriff, a person must

- be 21 years of age or older;
- have at least four years' experience as a full-time law enforcement officer or at least two years' experience as a full-time law enforcement officer with at least two years' post-high-school education; and
- not been convicted of a felony or of any other crime that would prevent the person from being certified as a police officer under ORS 181A.355 to 181A.670

NOTICE: Per ORS 206.015, if elected and not currently holding Oregon DPSST Basic Police Certification, the person elected or appointed to the office of sheriff must obtain the certification no later than one year after taking office. A copy of the certification shall be filed with the county clerk or the county official in charge of elections. *The county governing body shall declare the office of sheriff vacant when the person serving as sheriff is not certified as a police officer within one year after taking office.*
