The Earthquake Ready Burnside Bridge Project

Draft Environmental Impact Statement available for public review and input through March 22, 2021

Multnomah County, in partnership with the Federal Highway Administration, has published a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) on February 5th, 2021 kicking off a formal 45-day public comment period. The goal of the Draft EIS is to understand the impacts of all the bridge alternatives evaluated and recommend a single preferred alternative to move forward into design. The Draft EIS includes the recommended Preferred Alternative that you helped the County select in fall 2020.

Visit our <u>online open house</u> to view and learn about the Draft EIS, access technical reports & other supplemental materials, and submit public comment. Your comments will help the project team update the Draft EIS before submitting the Final EIS for approval in fall 2021.
